# Reminder: Tree and Shrub Sale October 20, 2012

The first ever fall Tree and Shrub sale by the GGC will be held at the Grapevine Botanical Gardens on

October 20, 2012 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. All profits from the sale will go to the Greenhouse project. In addition to the sale, seminars will be conducted throughout the sale hours. The seminars will be held in the Education Pavilion with the times and topics listed below:

Tree Selection. Pat Fairchild (Citizen Forester) 10:00 a.m. & 12:00 p.m.

Tree Planting. Callie Mitchell (Citizen Forester & Master Gardener) 10:30 a.m. & 12:30 p.m. Tree Watering. Unique Landscaping 11:00 a.m. & 1:00 p.m.

Tree Pruning. Barbara Atkins (Master Gardener) 11:30 a.m. & 1:30 p.m.

The committee has identified several outstanding trees and shrubs as candidates for the sale. They will be the size that you can take home, dig a small hole and plant this fall - the right time to plant a tree or shrub. For future reference, information about the plants will be posted on the GGC website. An email will be sent out prior to the sale with the availability list of trees and shrubs. Over 50 different varieties of trees and shrubs will be for sale. They are all native or adapted and not necessarily found in the local nurseries.

With the drought of the last two summers and the need to replace or fill in with new landscaping, this sale will provide the opportunity to purchase a native plant, grown locally at respected wholesalers, that will survive and provide years of beauty.

All GGC members will receive a 10% discount at the sale. There will not be a after sale, so come early and get the best selection.

Grapevine residents can take advantage of the Grapevine Tree Sharing program at the sale (at the cite support rate) while those in surrounding cities can select from the same 30 gallon tree at a rate special for the sale.

Come out and support the GGC and the Green House project.

There are always a few volunteer opportunities still open so if you can just attend the sale and help customers purchase plants and make the sale a success notify Chuck Voelker.

#### **Executive Board Actions**

Recently the GGC Executive Board voted on two actions for the club, described below. The first action was taken at the June 2012 Board meeting. The Board passed a motion for a new standing rule

Standing Rule (7) Use of GGC Meeting, Forum and Membership Roster: GGC restricts the use of the GGC meeting forum, membership list and email list to distribution of information that supports the GGC mission statement and by-laws of the organization. As a nonprofit organization, GGC does not take (offer) advertising of outside businesses. Sharing of the GGC membership list or email list with any requesters is not allowed.

This new standing rule is included in your yearbook on page 83.

The second action was taken at the September 2012 Board meeting and allocated \$8,850 of GGC assets in the 2012-2013 year to the Greenhouse Project. This brings the total GGC contribution to the Greenhouse Project to \$10,000.

Let me know if you are coming – I'm in the book, and I  $\underline{will}$  have a signup sheet at the October General Meeting.


