To Believe in Seeds...

C. JoyBell C. said, "Inside that tiny seed, lives the roots, branches, bark, trunk, leaves, twigs and apple fruit of that apple tree. You can't see, feel, hear, taste or smell any of that yet; nevertheless, it is all inside that seed. The moment the seed is in your hand—all of that is in your hand, too, from the root to the bark to the fruit! All you have to do is to push the seed into the soil. And what makes anyone plant any apple seed? It is the belief that in the seed, there is the tree. So, believe. To have a seed, is to have everything."

For years Thierrie has been the friendly face behind the Seed Table at our GGC meetings—distributing the seeds you have brought to share from your own gardens. Rose Trial Update

The most recent data collection was on Tuesday, November 1st. Attendance continues to be high for these monthly collections and we seem to have a dedicated group. A sincere thank you to all who have volunteered to assist in this Trial.

Unfortunately, we now have Rose Rosette disease on three roses. All three are in the same bed, but not next to each other. Wedding Bells has completely expired.

Also suffering from the disease is Betty Prior. Most disappointingly, Miracle on the Hudson has symptoms. Even with symptoms, Miracle has the best overall appearance of all the roses in the Trial by far, even the one plant that is exhibiting symptoms. This rose has not yet been made available to the public.

The research protocol calls for us to leave the afflicted roses in place. Please note this is NOT the recommended procedure if a rose in your garden has Rose Rosette disease. If you should find symptoms on a rose at your home, be sure to remove all parts of the rose, bag it, and send to the landfill.

GGC Scholarships

In Memoriam

Marion Brekken (1935-2016)

Grapevine Garden Club Honorary Life Member

In the early 1980s, the City of Grapevine did not appear to allocate significant funds toward landscape beautification projects for public buildings, city parks and public sites. From 1984-2002, several beautification landscape projects undertaken by the GGC may have influenced a change in attitude. Among these significant projects were the grounds of the police department and library (307 W. Dallas), Torian Cabin at Liberty Park, Town Square Park (Main Street gazebo), Heritage

Center (railroad depot), traffic medians, and wildflower seeding to provide colorful entrances at the city's main arteries.


Marion Brekken, who was a City Councilwoman from 1980-1986, stated, "I would say that there is more awareness of the fact that beautification has dividends, and possibly beautification of public grounds was a factor."

Marion's involvement in bringing the beautification projects to fruition and her commitment to Keep Grapevine Beautiful are how I primarily remember Marion Brekken. However, through the years, Marion served in numerous organizations and boards including the GCISD Board of Trustees.

Considering the GCISD Education Foundation's Marion Brekken STEM Endowment Fund, the two books selected by the GGC for the Grapevine Public Library in memory of Marion seem very appropriate. They are *Little Bits* by Amber Lovett and *Make: Getting started with littleBits* by Ayah Bdeir.

These books support the STEM curriculum based on the idea of educating students in four different disciplines—science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.

Remembering Our Friend, Peggy Reyher

Peggy Hoover Reyher left us last month, but with a wonderful legacy and fond memories. Peggy had been a member of the GGC for twenty years. Before she became mostly homebound the past two years, Peggy contributed to Flowercade every year, sometimes a cutting from her garden, at other times place settings and centerpieces. She helped at plant sales, served as a Saturday docent at the Botanical Gardens and enjoyed helping with many other garden projects such as Butterfly Flutterby.

Peggy had been an elementary school teacher and loved talking with children about nature. She also helped establish a Mini-Garden at the public library in 2004-2005, and was an active contributor to the Friends of the Grapevine Library and the Historical Society, in addition to the GGC.

Peggy was a friend to everyone she met, and never forgot a single person. She was a Scheherazade of story-telling, always having a story to share on almost any subject. Peggy had traveled extensively and established homes in four other states, not counting three different areas of Texas. She had accumulated much knowledge about gardening in all those different climates and soils.

We thank you, our friend, for your service and dedication. The GGC has donated *Texas: Getting Started Garden Guide* and *Month-by-Month Gardening: Texas* to the Grapevine Public Library in Peggy's memory.
