
# **Grapevine Garden Club November Program**

As always, cash and check donations for GRACE (Grapevine Relief and Community Exchange) will be accepted at the door.





### **Wildflower Planting**

They arrived at Parr Park wearing brown or blue vests and big smiles. These were the fourteen girls from Girl Scout Troops 1425 and 1405 and Daisy Troop 1402 who came to help us sow eighty pounds of wildflower seeds in a four-acre area of Parr Park. They pushed spreaders filled with seeds that in some cases came up to their shoulders. They used hand spreaders to sow some bags of seeds that they brought with them and Lisa Grove helped them plant some daffodils. The event was a big success for both kids and adults.

This is the third autumn for seed sowing in this ongoing project. Experience has taught us which seeds should be included and which should not. Lisa Grove and Wildseed Farms have come up with a custom mix for our area which includes:


